Can only be used before graduation.  | Part time (20 hours or less per week) employment that is directly related to an F-1 student's major area of study.                                  | Students' graduate program  | Provide documentation regarding the job         |
| Full-time<br>CPT      | Employment authorization for temporary employment that is directly related to an F-1 student's major area of study. Can only be used before graduation. | Full time employment that is directly related to an F-1 student's major area of study.  | Students' graduate program  | Provide documentation regarding the job         |
| OPT                   | Employment authorization for temporary employment. Can be used before or after graduation   | Part time (20 hours or less per week) or full-time employment that is directly related to an F-1 student's major area of study for up to 12 months. | Students' graduate program  | Provide documentation regarding the job         |
| J-1 visa              | Visa for exchange visitors  | Employment is authorized for J-1 nonimmigrants only under the terms of the exchange program   | Exchange sponsors designated<br>by Department of State (e.g.,<br>Educational Commission for<br>Foreign Medical Graduates) | Provide documentation regarding the job         |
| H-1B visa             | Temporary working visa that applies to people who wish to perform services in a specialty occupation  | Full time employment in the position delineated by the prospective employer   | The prospective employer  | Initiate application on behalf of your employee |
| Green Card            | Lawful permanent resident   | Little restriction on employment  | n/a   | n/a   |
